Mayor Malkin’s Speech:

Good evening everyone. Today we sit here at the start of a new year and a new decade. This one has an interesting connotation: 2020. The obvious definition is to have perfect vision, to see clearly. In an everyday sense it means to view a situation clearly or to look back and realize something with better clarity or understanding. I think, we in Roosevelt, have much to be proud of from 2019. Thanks to the collaborative effort and teamwork of our Council members, employees and professionals, I believe many issues in town have either been resolved, improved or are working toward a satisfactory resolution.

In the past year, we have brought the water/sewer system completely up to optimum conditions. Our water is safe, healthy and actually has no taste, which is how water should be, not to mention colorless. In addition, we have been commended by the DEP for our water/sewer reporting, which has been done in a timely manner and performed excellently. When there has been a problem, it’s been addressed immediately and resolved as quickly as possible.

As far as the streets and roads are concerned, we have received many grants from the DoT. In a four-year period, we have received \$1,000,000 in grants, which has allowed us to perform necessary work. Phase II of the Homestead Lane paving will begin in the spring and Phase I was completed eight years ago. After that will come Farm Lane, which is badly in need of paving. Little by little, incrementally, as we receive these grants we will replace and repair our infrastructure.

Our Public Works Department is constantly hard at work. From snow plowing to painting the Borough Hall inside and out, tending to all the buildings and grounds work that needs to be done, and almost any issue that arises, even if it doesn't exactly fit the job description, they are immediately on top of it. Can you believe how wonderful the Borough Hall looks? Aside from the fact that it was dated, seedy-looking and smelled bad, there was so much dirt and mold, that it was unhealthy. Now we have a beautiful building we're proud of and not embarrassed when visitors arrive.

We also have been utilizing shared services as much as possible to ensure low cost, high quality, high priority service. We are grateful to Millstone Township, Hightstown and the County for their willingness to provide these shared services. We opened the Roosevelt Park at the end of last summer and it's now a lovely spot or a respite with a sign to draw in visitors.

This past year also saw the recognition of Roosevelt as the truly, officially, historic, unique town that we all know it is. In October, there was a large celebration featuring an excellent documentary about Roosevelt's founding father, Benjamin Brown. It was a well-attended full weekend affair with many people coming from all over the country and our elected State Representatives were here as well. In November, an exhibit opened about Roosevelt at Morven, the museum and former Governor's mansion in Princeton. Again, at the opening reception, there was an overflowing crowd of both current and former Roosevelt residents. If you haven't visited, please do so. It will be there until May and it's just magnificent.

There were also the usual array of concerts and picnics in town and for some nice diversions, we had a family of goats on the loose, which most of the town participated in trying to corral. And we have an albino deer which many of us have spotted and I was lucky enough to see it two different times. I've been told that they are extremely rare, one in maybe twenty or thirty thousand is albino and he hasn't been killed yet which is also miraculous because he has been around for months.

As we now start 2020, I look forward to continuing to pursue whatever is in Roosevelt's best interest. As proud as I am of what has been accomplished, we do have various issues that need to be addressed in the coming year. We are all aware that our school is under threat of closing due to State budget cuts. But rest assured, no one is taking this in stride. The Principle, School Board President and I have attended many meetings and have fought hard to try to receive an exemption. I don't want to be overly self-confident but it looks more hopeful than it had been.

Our First Aid Squad is in dire need of volunteers, as is the case in most towns. Right now, we are receiving help from Millstone, Allentown and some other sources when our members are unavailable. But this is only a stop-gap solution. Very soon we'll be actively seeking a more optimal solution.

As you may know, Hilltop Swim Club will most likely be sold and it remains to be seen what will transpire there. I was very pleased when the abandoned gas station was finally raised after well over thirty years of being an eyesore. I don't want to see an empty plot of land sit there for thirty years, so we will be exploring many possibilities for that lot.

I again want to implore residents, that if you have any suggestions, ideas, questions, you have many options: you can come to Council meetings. If that's not convenient, feel free to call or stop by the Borough Hall during working hours. We are open to anything residents have on their mind. Our Governing Body prides itself on being transparent, understanding and fair.

At this point I want to thank all the people who contribute to the inner workings of our town. It may be a tiny town but it takes a lot of people to run it. If there is anyone I have forgotten, I'm

really sorry. I want to start with Ana Debevec, Kathleen Hart, Lori Maher and Kim Cuiffi. They are our administrative staff and there's not enough time to discuss the exemplary job that they do or how lucky we are to have them. We have Greg Defoe and Greg Possiel, our Public Works employees, and their good work is more visible to everyone since so much of it is outside. John Holden and Mike Lyons are our water/sewer operators and we have them to thank for our vastly improved systems. Carmela Roberts, our Engineer, fights hard for us, whether in obtaining grants (she's the one responsible for the \$1,000,000 in grants over the past four years), or representing us in various matters. George Lang and Gerry Stankeiwicz are our financial professionals and they have both worked for Roosevelt for a very long time and always have our best interest at heart. They are also always available to us when we need them ASAP. Sam Cannizarro is our Tax Collector who takes the time to work with many residents when they need him. Donna Taylor is our Tax Assessor and she is also readily available to residents. Jeremy Kuipers is the Zoning, Housing and Code Enforcement Officer. He took over more than a year ago and has become a real asset to us. Greg Cannon and Michele Donato are our Borough and Planning Board Attorneys. They excel at their jobs and are also very cognizant of our budgetary constraints. Our Borough Councilmembers, who work tirelessly with no complaints, in a job that isn't easy and isn't always rewarding, although we do laugh a lot: Joe Trammell, Mike Hamilton, Steve Bowen, Luke Dermody, Lou Esakoff and Chad Vroman. And finally, all the people in town who volunteer, helping to keep Roosevelt, Roosevelt: First Aid members, Planning Board members, Environmental Commission members, RAP members, litter pickup crews, Historian Chair Michael Tickin and various representatives and School Board members. I want to thank Kenny Horowitz for providing a wonderful 4th of July picnic for us each year. He donates two huge grills and has them delivered and picked up. John Block from East Windsor Flooring who gives us a price, as low as possible, whenever we need products or service and then I beg him to lower it even more and he does. And all the neighbors who help each other in more ways than I can ever name given that we are rather isolated here and people form family-like friendships. Thank you, everyone, for all that you do.
