Dear Mayor/County Commissioner/County Executive:

On behalf of Governor Phil Murphy, I am pleased to announce that applications will now be accepted for the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) Fiscal Year 2023 State Aid programs. The deadline for grant application submissions is July 1<sup>st</sup>. Grant awards are expected to be announced in November.

As you may know, the Transportation Trust Fund Reauthorization Act of 2016 increased funding for Local Aid programs to counties and municipalities from \$190 million per year to \$430 million. The reason for the steep increase is that the majority of New Jersey's roadway mileage—about 90 percent—is under local government jurisdiction and is in as much need of repair as the state roadway network.

Over the past year, improvements to the grant application and project delivery processes have been implemented.

- The Project Management and Reporting System (PMRS) was launched. This new system reduces paper consumption and adds efficiencies. You will continue to submit applications through SAGE (System for Administering Grants Electronically), but you are now required to submit your Resolution of Support through the PMRS platform no later than July 31st.
- Your grant announcement and project management processes will now be through PMRS. Older projects will be phased into the PMRS platform in the next two months.
- A Map Maker Tool is now available to all grant applicants to standardize all map submissions.

This year, following federal and state guidance, equity is incorporated into all State Aid programs to promote an equitable delivery of government benefits. Additional points will be added to projects in areas where vulnerable populations exist. Current census data will be used to determine if a project meets the equity criteria. Equity information will be available on NJDOT's Local Aid Resource Center website at: NJ DOT - Local Aid Resource Center (njdotlocalaidre.com)

A series of training classes were held to communicate the changes, and a wide range of informational resources were developed and are now available on our Local Aid Resource Center website. Please reach out to the Local Aid Resource Center with any questions.

The following is a brief description of each grant program:

- Municipal Aid This \$151.25 million program with an additional \$10 million in Urban Aid provides
  funding for local transportation projects for a total of \$161.25 million. Municipalities are encouraged
  to consider projects that support walking and biking safety.
- Transit Village\* This program is open to the 34 municipalities that have been designated as Transit Villages by the Commissioner of Transportation and the inter-agency Transit Village Task Force. A total of \$1 million is available to fund traditional and non-traditional transportation projects that enhance walking, biking and/or transit ridership within a half mile of the transit facility. The approved Transit Village municipalities are provided in the following link: <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/transportation/business/localaid/transitvillagef.shtm">http://www.state.nj.us/transportation/business/localaid/transitvillagef.shtm</a>
- Bikeways\* This \$1 million program is intended to fund bicycle projects which create new Bike Path Mileage. This program encourages new bikeways that are physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic by an open space or barrier, but on-road bike lanes and other bike routes and facilities are also eligible for funding. Counties and municipalities are eligible.
- Safe Streets to Transit\* This program encourages counties and municipalities to construct safe and accessible pedestrian linkages to transit facilities to promote transit usage for all. A total of \$1 million is available for grant awards.

\*Note: An additional \$15.3 million was provided in the FY 22 state budget to disperse among these programs for a total of \$18.3 million allowing the award of many more grants and more fully funded grants.

All projects funded through the Transportation Trust Fund must comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). ADA guidance, program descriptions and application guidance materials can be found on the NJDOT website at: <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/transportation/business/localaid/stateaid.shtm">http://www.state.nj.us/transportation/business/localaid/stateaid.shtm</a>

If you choose to apply, please be aware that Municipal Aid regulations require projects receiving this type of aid to award a construction contract within 24 months from the date of grant notification.

I encourage you to submit applications for these Local Aid programs. Each program application will be evaluated independently, affording counties and municipalities the opportunity to receive funding in more than one category.

The enclosed map provides contact information for each Local Aid District Office. If you need assistance preparing your application, please contact your Local Aid District Office. Please keep in mind that a separate application for each project must be completed and submitted on or before **July 1st, 2022**, online through the Department's electronic grants administration system, known by its acronym, SAGE, at: <a href="https://njsage.intelligrants.com/Login.aspx?APPTHEME=NJSAGE">https://njsage.intelligrants.com/Login.aspx?APPTHEME=NJSAGE</a>

As Commissioner of Transportation, I am committed to maintaining and improving New Jersey's local transportation infrastructure by providing financial assistance, technical expertise, and training in surmounting the application process for traditional and non-traditional local transportation initiatives. Our counties and municipalities will be well positioned to design and construct important local projects without the need to impact property taxes. Your success in building projects and spending the additional capital will mean success not only for your constituents, but for the entire state.



BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO TAMARA DRIVE BETWEEN PINE DRIVE AND SOUTH ROCHDALE AVENUE, APPROPRIATING \$419,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$419,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY

- BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:
- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as Water-Sewer Utility improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Roosevelt, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$419,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor. No down payment is required or appropriated herein, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11c of the Local Bond Law, as this bond ordinance authorizes obligations solely for purposes which are self-liquidating and deductible from the gross debt of the Borough as set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7h. Additionally, this bond ordinance authorizes projects intended to be funded through the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank Financing Program.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of a down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$419,000, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized to be undertaken consist of improvements to Tamara Drive between Pine Drive and South Rochdale Avenue in the Borough, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Chief Financial Officer, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$419,000, as stated in Section 2 hereof.

- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$419,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as Water-Sewer Utility improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is twenty (20) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is not increased by the authorization of the \$419,000 bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance because the purposes authorized herein are self-liquidating and are deductible from the Borough's gross debt in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-44c and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$59,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.
- (f) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Borough solely for purposes described in subparagraph (h) of §40A:2-7 of the Local Bond Law, and the obligations authorized herein are to be issued for purposes which are self-liquidating within the meaning and limitation of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-45 of said Law and are deductible from the gross debt of the Borough pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-44c and N.J.S.A. 40A:2-46 of said Law.
- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.
- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

- BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:
- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Roosevelt, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$610,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including \$173,700 grant funds expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT"). No down payment is required or appropriated herein, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11c of the Local Bond Law. Additionally, this bond ordinance authorizes projects intended to be funded through the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank Financing Program.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of a down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$436,300, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized to be undertaken consist of improvements to Tamara Drive between Pine Drive and South Rochdale Avenue in the Borough, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Chief Financial Officer, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$436,300, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$610,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The

excess of the appropriation of \$610,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of \$173,700 in grant funds expected to be received by NJDOT

- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. - (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is twenty (20) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is not increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$436,300 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.
- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall

constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.

- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.
- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS FIRE DISTRICT NO. 1 MILLSTONE TOWNSHIP AND THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISIONERS FIRE DISTRICT NO. 1 MILLSTONE TOWNSHIP AND THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et. seq. "The Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act" provides, in relevant part, that units of local government may enter into an agreement with any other unit of local government to provide or receive any service that each local government unit is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No. 1 Millstone Township is a duly constituted fire district established for the purpose of providing fire protection/suppression services in Millstone Township and the Borough of Roosevelt is a duly constituted political subdivision of the State of New Jersey authorized by law to provide essential governmental services including fire protection and suppression services to its citizens; and

WHEREAS, The Board and the Borough have heretofore entered into a Shared Services Agreement whereby the Board has provided fire protection and first responder emergency medical services to the Borough and the Borough has agreed to pay the Board for said services at the same rate and level the taxpayers of Millstone Township pay to support and provide said services; and

**WHEREAS**, the parties to this Agreement wish to continue and extend the terms and provisions of the previously executed Shared Services Agreement as modified and expanded.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No. 1 Millstone Township and the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roosevelt as follows:

1. The Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No. 1 Millstone Township shall provide fire protection and suppression services to all citizens and property located within the boundaries of the Borough of Roosevelt and shall also provide emergency medical services, heretofore referred to as Basic Life Support Services (BLS Services) to all residents and persons located within the Borough of Roosevelt.

- 2. All services to be provided hereunder shall be provided to the same degree and level of services provided by the Millstone Township Fire District No. 1 to the residents and property owners of Millstone Township Fire District No. 1.
- 3. This agreement shall have a FIVE (5) YEAR DURATION commencing on the date and ratification of this Resolution by both parties to this Agreement.
- 4. The Borough shall collect ad valorem taxes on its real property at the same rate and level as established and collected by the Township of Millstone on behalf of the Board of Fire Commissioners as provided by N.J.S.A. 40A:14-79 et. seq.
- 5. The Borough recognizes and agrees that this agreement does not vest it with authority or jurisdiction to govern or control the Fire District its operations or personnel and the Fire District retains all rights and powers granted it by N.J.S.A. 40A:14-81.
- 6. All tax payments due pursuant to this Agreement shall be payable to the District in Four (4) Quarterly payments in the same manner as set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:14-79 et. seq.
- 7. The parties hereto acknowledge and preserve the "BILLING AND COMPENSATION" provisions set forth in the "First Amendment to Shared Services Agreement for Fire Protection/Suppression Services between Millstone Township Fire District No. 1 and the Borough of Roosevelt" dated 2/22/2021 which are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth at length.
- 8. This Agreement shall become fully effective on May 21, 2022 after passage and adoption by both parties hereto.
